


Data Review



- NPT has the highest proportion of disabled people in Wales 24.6% (ONS)
- NPT has the highest proportion of unpaid carers 12.3% in Wales
- 235 Carers Needs Assessments completed in 22/23
- ¼ of Carers Needs Assessments identified an eligible need
- Average age of an adult unpaid carer is 55-59yrs old
- 75% of carers identified were Female
- Unpaid Carers support in equivalent monetary value equates to £618 million for NPT



Findings so far

- Multiple entry points
- Transition
- Carers Assessments/Care Plans
- Support for Carers 'hidden' in cared for person care plan
- Awareness of available support

- Integration between services
- Identification of Carers
- Waiting times

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- SLA focus on outputs not
 - outcomes



Key Challenges

- Separation of commissioning and delivery
- Information Transfer
- Access to Support
- Carer Involvement



Next Steps

- Demonstrator Pilot
- Carer Engagement 2 Phases
- Widen the review to include young carers and parent carers ("big picture")
- Establish a Carer's Services Review Steering Group
- Participate in national discussions re: Carers Needs Assessments
- Support Ombudsman's Own Investigation
- Develop options for ongoing delivery of carers support
